#### Dear Friends and Fellow Servants of Christ,


**St. Paul UMC** and the Mission Increase Director, Lori Simms Parks, at the **Life Enrichment Center** are grateful for ways in which each of you and the groups whom you represent have partnered with St. Paul. We, out of both our poverty and abundance, wish to give back and also further our common work in alleviating poverty and serving the poor.

**During Lent on March 11 from 1-3pm** St. Paul UMC with the support of Think Tank INC. will offer a **Poverty Simulation** (COPE-Cost of Poverty Experience). Jesus tells us that the poor will always be with us but maybe we can learn more how to be with the poor.

This is a truth discovery event that allows people to participate in role playing a month in the life of someone in poverty. You need not know a great deal about poverty or you may have served in churches, neighborhoods and agencies that serve the poor. You will not be on stage and singularly called out. Because of funding through the Miami Valley District of the UMC Mission committee we are able to make this possible as a free event. You are being specifically invited because of the partnership that you have with us.

There are a limited number of people who can participate. Therefore, you and your team must personally register with us for the event. The registration will be on a first come first serve bases and it is important that you register participants by name.

This training was developed here in the region and has served as the experience for people who work in agencies like CareSource who serve Medicaid families. Also, COPE has recently been introduced to TD Jakes Ministries, Inc. in Dallas and will become a primary introduction there and elsewhere nationally to working with people in poverty.

St. Paul United Methodist Church is able to provide free help with tax filing through a grant from the Ohio Association of Foodbanks and many hours of volunteer service. St. Paul is one of 43 organizations across Ohio that received funding to support the expansion of their free tax filing services through the Ohio Benefit Bank.

In 2016, St. Paul serviced 225 residents of the Miami Valley. "This year, we hope to serve even more residents and help them to keep the full tax refunds they have earned," States Vicki Morris, program coordinator.
