## Open Hearts, Open Minds, Open Doors

Upbeat music and passionate preaching in beautiful outdoor surroundings set the stage for a celebration of accomplishment. On June 24th, St. Paul UMC recognized English as a Second Language students and Bible study participants during a worship service at the Normandy UMC shelter house. The students received Spanish Bibles and certificates for their effort and hard work.

The celebration was the first service conducted entirely in Spanish by this small congregation on the east side of Dayton. "The breakthrough for us as Anglos was the decision to make it a Spanish service," Church Administrator Joan Johnson said. Previously, worship had been conducted in English and Spanish once a month.

Beginning in the fall, St. Paul UMC will offer weekly worship services in Spanish. Worship design and leadership will be done largely by the church's women's group Las Amigas. Rebekah Clapp, St. Paul's Hispanic Ministries Coordinator, leads the group. "Las Amigas members will be planning, doing liturgy, [and] reading scripture," Clapp said. Taking a lead-ership role is a first for many of the women involved in the group.

[The church plans to add Sunday School to the new worship schedule. Children and Youth Coordinator, Beth Vanoli, will implement the church school with assistance from volunteers. The newly intergrated Youth Program, led by Rebekah Sherick, will also be on Sunday evenings.]



Other new ministries of this **Immigrant Welcoming Congregation** include a partnership with the Kettering Literacy Council to offer computer literacy courses and citizenship classes. The church also hosts a local immigration lawyer who offers free legal advice for a limited number of cases. Above all, St. Paul UMC strives to be in relationship with their neighbors. The leadership team attributes their success to their steadfast desire to care about their community. "We don't have a lot of people, but those who come are really committed, that commitment is really [how] we can grow our congregation," Clapp said.
